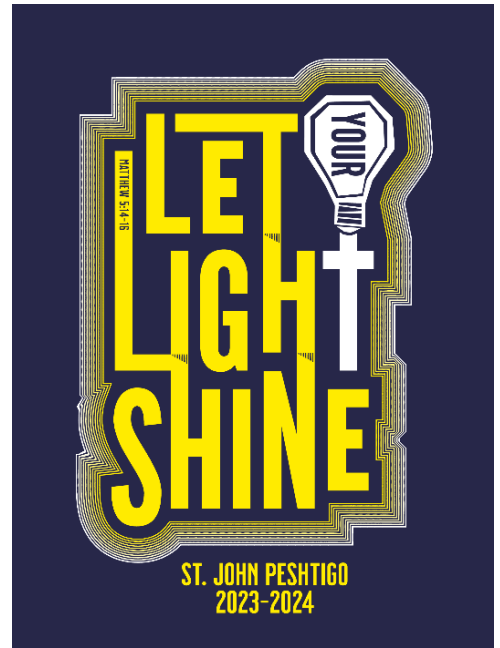


Mrs. Myslik's K-1 News and Notes
